
BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE (BYOD) PARENT INFORMATION

SCHOOL DIRECTION

Our school has embraced a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) approach for enriching the learning of students and teachers since 2016. Electronic devices are used to promote genuine learning, research, problem solving and positive communication. We support our students to become digitally responsible cyber citizens.



DEPARTMENT DIRECTION

The Department of Education is encouraging most schools with a reliable infrastructure to undertake NAPLAN online. Last year at Walkerville Primary we delivered NAPLAN online. iPad's were the most reliable device for this mode of delivery.

AIM

Students are actively engaged in the process of defining problems and opportunities, designing, implementing and evaluating digital solutions, and creating and sharing information that meets a range of current and future needs. These solutions and information are created through the application of computational and design thinking, and technical skills.

Use technology to solve problems, answer questions and communicate what has been learned to others.



Recent changes to technology have changed the climate of personal learning devices. They have become powerful, versatile and reliable.

Walkerville Primary School Recommends iPads. Once in the WPS environment they become a managed device. A secure certificate is installed and then each device is using the school network.



ADVANTAGES

- Long battery life (all day device)
- Light and portable
- Add-on keyboards
- Low physical footprint on tables and in the classroom. Size of an average A4 book
- Reliable hardware (WiFi)
- Easily repaired (cheap)
- Same problems same solutions. Students/Staff can often solve their own problems
- Powerful apps for education

 85% of students currently in year 2 and 3 indicated they already have an iPad at home

 Students have experience using them as WPS provides iPads for shared use in R-2 classrooms

How does Walkerville Primary School create a safe learning environment?

- Providing filtering in addition to the automatically managed Safe Search function on browsers. This program actively prevents inappropriate material from showing up on screen.
- Running Cyber-Safety lessons at school, where each class delivers a set of ACMA (Australian Communication and Media Authority) approved lessons focused on cyber safety.
- Restricting access to certain functions in settings
- Ensuring that all online components of programs are password protected and managed locally by the teacher, technician and coordinator
- Our technician is able to investigate who is online and what is accessed while at school
- iPads are locked inside classrooms during breaks during the day by the classroom teacher
- Students and families read and sign the school Cyber Safety use agreement so they are on the same page

HOW ARE THEY USED?

- 1. 'Just in time learning' (immediate source of information for answers and solving problems)
- 2. Airplay (allows students to show what they are learning/ working on onto the classroom interactive TV and collaborate/ receive feedback
- 3. Learning continuity is enhanced by providing full access to learning programs at school and at home.
- 4. Homework, projects, research and publishing in all curriculum areas.
- 5. Self-Directed Learning. At the core of the Australian Curriculum are important life skills that include the ability to locate accurate information through self-directed internet browsing. This is not 'Free-time'. It is, however, learning led by the student with the teacher's scaffolding, supervision and guidance.

LEARNLINK EMAIL ADDRESS

All students in Year 3-7 receive a LearnLink email address from the Department for Education.

Your child/s teacher, our ICT coordinator or ICT technician will help your child set this up on their iPad.

This will activate Microsoft Office 365 suite of apps for free for student use.

- LearnLink Office 365 is a customised package of Microsoft Office 365, tailored for the South Australian public education system, and is offered at no additional charge to families whilst their student remains enrolled at Walkerville Primary School.
- Microsoft Office 365 is available for students and staff to install on their devices.
- Students will be shown how to use their Learnlink email account to log in to office.com and again to activate the software after you have installed it.
- Even if you are already using Office 365 with a family account, you will need to switch to using your Learnlink account to be able to use Office 365 collaboratively with staff and students at school.





WHAT SHOULD I GET FOR MY CHILD?

- If you would like to participate in the Walkerville Primary School BYOD program, we recommend the following;
- iPad (6th, 7th or 8th generation), iPad Air (2020), iPad Air (2019), iPad Pro (9.7-inch), iPad Pro (10.5-inch), iPad Pro (11-inch), iPad Pro (12.9-inch). iPad mini (2019) is also fine.
- Must be running iOS 13+ If it won't update to iOS 13 or higher then it may not work on our network consistently
- Wireless keyboard
- Label the iPad/ cover for identification
